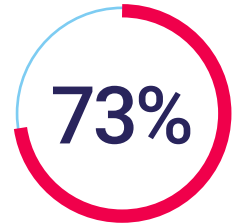


What surgeons are saying.

Providing advice or expertise to a governor, mayor, other public official, or committee on their COVID-19 response

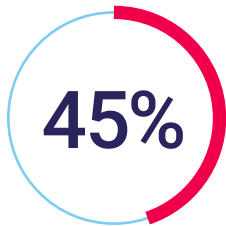


Working in a different specialty than trained to fight COVID-19

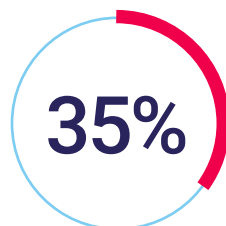
